

STATEMENT ON MODERN DAY SLAVERY AND HUMAN TRAFFICKING

This anti-slavery/anti-human trafficking statement (this “**Statement**”) is made pursuant to Section 54, Part 6 of the Modern Slavery Act 2015 (the “**Act**”) and has been adopted by Inspired Entertainment Inc. and all its subsidiaries (“**Inspired**”) as our statement on modern day slavery and human trafficking for the financial year ending 31 December 2025. This Statement sets out the steps taken by us to prevent the occurrence of modern-day slavery and/or human trafficking in our business or in any of our supply chains between 1st January and 31st December 2025.

Background

We are a global gaming technology company headquartered in the United States, with principal operating facilities located in the United Kingdom, India and Italy. As of 31 December 2025, we employed approximately 1,022 employees. We supply content, platform and other products and services to online and land-based regulated lottery, betting and gaming operators worldwide through a broad range of distribution channels, on a business-to-business basis. We provide end-to-end digital gaming solutions (i) on our own proprietary and secure network, which accommodates a wide range of devices, including land-based gaming machine terminals, mobile devices and online computer applications and (ii) through third party networks. Our content and other products can be found through the consumer-facing portals of interactive customers and, through land-based customers, in licensed betting offices, adult gaming centers, pubs, bingo halls, and motorway service areas.

Our customer base includes lotteries, sports bookmakers, gaming and bingo halls, casinos and online operators, adult gaming centers, pubs, and motorway service areas. Our products are designed to operate within applicable gaming, betting or lottery regulations and our customers are regulated gaming, sportsbook or lottery operators or are otherwise licensed to operate our products. We are licensed or certified (as applicable) by the Gambling Commission in the UK, (the “UK Gambling Commission”), the Hellenic Gaming Commission in Greece, and registered with L’Agenzia delle Dogane e dei Monopoli (“ADM”) in Italy. We are licensed by regulators in other jurisdictions such as the Malta Gaming Authority (Malta), the Licensing Authority of Gibraltar (Gibraltar), the Alderney Gambling Control Commission (Channel Islands), the Belgian Kansspel Commissie (Belgium), Oficiul National pentru Jocuri de Noroc (Romania), Spelinspektionen, the Swedish Gaming Authority (Sweden), Ministerio de Comercio Exterior y Turismo (MINCETUR) in Peru, and we hold licenses with the U.S. states of Connecticut, Illinois, Michigan, Delaware, New Jersey, Oregon, Pennsylvania, and West Virginia, and the Canadian provinces of Alberta, Nova Scotia, Manitoba, Quebec, Ontario and Saskatchewan.

Our Supply Chain

Given the strictly regulated nature of the gaming sector in the UK, US, and the other markets in which Inspired operates, we consider the risk for our business to be affected by modern day slavery and/or human trafficking as low. However, we remain alert to such risks and consistently verify and audit all our suppliers with a view towards addressing such risks. Our supplier agreements include provisions obliging our suppliers to comply with all applicable laws, including without limitation those relating to combatting the problem of modern-day slavery, child labour, and human trafficking.

Our employees are advised to pay particular attention to suppliers that provide services from higher risk territories and immediately report any concerns to our Executive Management or Legal and Compliance Teams who will promptly investigate and take appropriate action in the event that such concerns are reported.

We have developed a number of compliance policies designed to combat any unethical business conduct and expect our suppliers to comply with our Code of Ethics. We have also established whistleblower policies and associated hotlines set up for employees to raise any such concerns or raise any issue that may come to their attention. Other pertinent Inspired policies and standards include:

- ISO 9001 compliant Control of External Providers’ policy
- Anti-Corruption & Bribery Policy

- Insider Trading Policy
- Conflict of Interest Policy
- ISO 27001 compliant Information Security Management System

We expect our suppliers to share our commitment to human rights and adopt a zero tolerance approach to modern slavery. The use of forced or slave labour, whether in the form of indentured, bonded or prison labour by any entity within the Inspired supply chain is prohibited. Additionally, support of human trafficking of involuntary labour through threat, force, fraudulent claims or any other form of coercion is also prohibited. Where it is found that a supplier has breached this policy then the relationship with that supplier shall immediately be terminated.

We will continue to monitor and review our processes to prevent any form of modern-day slavery and/or human trafficking in our business or supply chain.

Supplier Lifecycle Management

Notwithstanding existing policies and controls Inspired has a dedicated project in place to holistically manage the supplier lifecycle. This is being spearheaded by Inspired’s Director of Procurement and is sponsored by the VP of Commercial Operations.


Fundamental to this will be succinct, routine and uniform risk evaluation as part of the due diligence process prior to any contractual agreement being formed with a supplier and prior to any onboarding. This process will include continual monitoring and assessment through the lifetime of contractual agreement until the termination and subsequent disengagement of a supplier.

The majority of the project is complete with the only remaining step being the rolling out of a new system which is currently in final phase of testing. All other risk evaluation and ongoing monitoring and assessment processes have been put in place, and the project is thus expected to be fully established in the first half of 2026

The Company also conducted an “in person” audit on its Asian supply chain during August 2025, as part of its ongoing commitment to regular visits of the region to ensure standards remain high. On this audit, all of the major suppliers were visited to ensure that they were operating in line with this policy. The result of this visit was positive, with all suppliers visited operating at a high standard with no concerns noted.

Annual Review

We will conduct an annual review of this Statement.
